PROFESSOR DENNIS PANTIN

Dennis Pantin is Professor, Department of Economics, University of the West Indies in St. Augustine, Trinidad and Tobago. He also is the Sustainable Economic Coordinator of Development Unit(SEDU) based within this Department and is currently serving a second term as its Head of Department. He received a BSc. Economics degree from UWI, St. Augustine and an M.Phil (Development Studies) from the Institute of Development Studies, University of Sussex. He spent a year of scholarly leave at the Institute for Ecological Economics (USA); and the Centre for Social and Economic Research on the Global Environment (CSERGE), University College, London(UK), respectively; and an earlier period of study leave at the Institute for Environmental Studies, University of Toronto, Canada.

He also has conducted policy oriented research on sustainable development related issues in several countries of the Caribbean including Belize, Jamaica, St. Lucia, Grenada, Guyana and Trinidad and Tobago. He has published in regional and international journals; is author of the Economics of Sustainable Development in Caribbean SIDS and Editor of the recently published Reader in Caribbean Economy. He will be one of the co-authors of a forthcoming book on the Economics of an Integrated (Watershed) approach to environmental management in Small Island developing states (SIDS). He also currently is serving as Chairman of the Regulated Industries Commission (RIC) of Trinidad and Tobago and of the Organisation of Caribbean Utility Regulators (OCCUR).

He also is a founding member of the T&T Economics Association (TTEA); the Association of Caribbean Economists(ACE) and the Constitution Reform forum (CRF) of Trinidad and Tobago.
