



SLDD'S PROJECT NOTICE

PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES (PWDS)

AS CHANGE AGENTS FOR

UPCYCLING WASTE PLASTICS (PWDSUP)

The project aims to increase the scope and scale of T&T's waste management practices using the abilities and skill set of PWDs as well as NGOs in support, to adopt technologies and business support services for upcycling waste plastic into a range of affordable products and social entrepreneurship opportunities.

The first phase of the Persons with Disabilities Upscaling Plastic (PWDsUP) project was successfully completed in October 2021. The Project Team, consisting of staff from the Faculty of Engineering (Dr. Chris Maharaj and Mr. Abhai Lal), the Student Life and Development Department (Dr. Jacqueline Huggins and Mr. Anil Maharaj) and Ms. Indira Jagassar (STACIE, UWI) are presently embarking on the completion of the second phase. This phase will include a pilot exercise whereby persons with disabilities from the National Centre for Persons with Disabilities (NCPD) and the Consortium of Disabled organizations (CODO) will be trained by the engineers in 3D printing of filament created from waste plastic and they will also explore different products that can be made from the recycling plastics.

This project was initiated in 2019 when the Global Environment Facility Small Grants Programme (GEF SGP) within the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) agreed to partner with The University of the West Indies to direct attention and funding for the inclusion of Persons with Disabilities in the national response to plastic pollution mitigation.

DR. HUGGINS APPOINTED TO "ONE UWI" DISABILITY POLICY COMMITTEE

Our very own Dr. Jacqueline Huggins, Manager of the Student Life & Development Department, was co-opted as a member of the "One UWI Disability Policy Committee" under the auspices of the University Registrar, Dr. Maurice Smith, to contribute to the development of a policy to protect the rights of staff and students with disabilities at The University of the West Indies. The SLDD has also contributed to the process by facilitating a focus group consisting of staff and students with disabilities and other key stakeholders such as past students and a representative of the Guild of Students. Other key stakeholders on the campus also provided comments on the draft document. The draft document was presented to the Board of Undergraduate Studies on February 8th 2022 and it was well received with some suggestions for editing. It is hoped that the Policy will come into effect in the new academic year 2022-2023.

SLDD

The SLDD is expanding its practice of research with two research projects that are underway.

1- A review of the Immigration programme for International and Regional Students. The review will be looking at the challenges, positive experiences and the process conducted by the Immigration Division and the SLDD in providing support for student who have to receive/renew landing passes.

2. A research paper is being conducted on Students with Disabilities and Self Advocacy before, During and after Postsecondary Education (The UWI).

SAFCS

Our Student Activities, Facilities & Commuting Students Department continues to develop self-help videos for students.

Disability Student Support

The Student Disability WhatsApp group has continued to flourish and provide critical support to students with disabilities and medical conditions as the University still grapples with the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. The policy for the group was recently revised to ensure that the SLDD continues to provide a safe space for participating students. This group will allow for the facilitation of daily discussions and connections between students in a safe space. The connection is also expected to lead to an increased membership and lead to retention in the SLDD Student Support Group. A satisfaction survey was conducted with members of the group in 2021 and there was favourable feedback about the implementation of the SLDD COVID-19 response and the engagement of students with disabilities and medical conditions.
