

Qualifications for Admission

B.Sc. Public Sector Management Special with an International Relations Minor

1. Applicants must satisfy the requirements in either (a) and (b) or (c) or (d) below:
 - (a) CXC/CSEC or GCE 'O' Level passes in a minimum of five (5) subjects. Subjects requirements are Mathematics and English Language. A minimum of a Grade II before 1998 or Grade III after 1998 in Mathematics at the CSEC General Level / 'O' Level
 - (b) CAPE or GCE 'A' Level passes in a minimum of two (2) subjects. CAPE subjects must consist of both Unit 1 and Unit 2; or
 - (c) An associate degree, Diploma and/or Certificate from other approved tertiary institutions having attained a B+ average or a minimum GPA of 2.5; or
 - (d) High school Grade 12 transcript with a minimum GPA of 3.0 and a minimum SAT I score of 1700 plus a minimum of two (2) SAT II subjects at a score of 500 or above or successful completion of Advanced Placement Courses or the International Baccalaureate programme.
2. Successful completion of the English Language Proficiency Test (ELPT) . Students with the following qualifications are exempt from the ELPT examination: (i) A grade 'A' or 'B' in General Paper, (ii) Grade I in CXC English Language (General Proficiency).

Certificate in Public Administration (CPA)

To be admitted to the prescribed course of study for the Certificate in Public Administration, candidates must: *be matriculated students of the University; and have in the opinion of the University, practical experience or other qualifications of special relevance to the course. Persons seeking admission will normally be required to have had about five years' experience of civil service work or other relevant experience.*

Candidates seeking admission, who do not satisfy the requirements at 2(i) but who are deemed capable of doing the standard of work required for the Certificate may be permitted to enter the Certificate course, at the discretion of the Faculty.

Its structure also considers the time factor; with class schedules on evenings and weekends adequately meeting the constraints posed by pursuing a Day-time Programme.

The Evening University Programme-South Initiative

It has always been The University's aim to provide access to tertiary level education and to do so in an environment which comfortably stimulates and enhances your learning process. The Evening University South Initiative provides a platform for expansion of the University's educational thrust in South Trinidad. This Initiative which started in 2011, offers an opportunity for Evening students to register and attend classes for specific programmes and courses at an alternate venue in the South Trinidad. At the inception of the Evening University South Initiative, only specific highly-subscribed level one courses were offered. Four years later, the Initiative has expanded with the offering of two programmes from the Faculty of Social Sciences.
