#### **COURSE DOCUMENTATION**

COURSE TITLE: Let's Talk Yoruba

NO. OF HOURS: 20 (2.5 hours per week for 8 weeks)

SEMESTER: May - July

**PREREQUISITES: NONE** 

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

Let's Talk Yoruba will help students develop their communicative skills in the Yoruba language and explore culturally appropriate behavior in basic, social interactions, especially related to everyday situations. Yoruba is a tonal language and as such, each online session will sensitize the students to the importance of tonal accents on vowels in words, their meaning and contextual usage. The primary focus will be on word articulation, contextual usage and cultural values while also developing the four skills involved in language learning (i.e. reading, writing, listening and speaking). As this is a conversation course, emphasis will be placed on oral comprehension and production, as well as on the analysis of all sort of texts and dialogues. In this way, the course aims to strengthen students' performance in communicative and immersion scenarios of Yoruba as a foreign language.

Students of this course are not required to have any prior formal knowledge of the language. This course is specifically designed to provide beginners with fundamental skills, laying the foundation for their future mastery of the language. Previous students of Yoruba desirous of refreshing their speaking skills are also welcome. Over the eight-week period (20 hours), students will be introduced to simple phrases and key vocabulary and given many opportunities to interact online. They will be encouraged to be proactive so as to develop their autonomy and confidence in the target language.

#### **COURSE RATIONALE:**

This course will give students the opportunity to study one of the region's heritage languages. Students of Yoruba develop a better understanding of this culture and heritage, which are evident during carnival through calypso, steel pan and dance. The primary objective is to provide students with the basic communicative skills necessary to function in predictable everyday situations and to be able to connect with the international Yoruba-speaking community for professional, social or religious reasons. Students will continue to acquire learning strategies to support them in these endeavors.



Let's Talk Yoruba will also provide opportunities for students continuing on from Level 1B and 2A Yoruba to review and strengthen their knowledge of previous content. Once students are accustomed to articulating Yoruba words correctly and speaking in Yoruba in class, they will be further encouraged to build on this until they are comfortable using the language in front of strangers.

## **GOALS/AIMS:**

This course seeks to strengthen students in listening and speaking skills framed within the <u>CEFR</u> <u>A1</u> level and <u>mid-Novice</u> level of American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages, Proficiency Guidelines 2012. At this level, learners are expected to understand the main points of clear, standard input on familiar matters regularly encountered in daily life. The student can communicate in a simple way on topics that are familiar or of personal interest. The student can describe themselves and others, provide personal details, inscribe tonal accents on vowels, demonstrate an understanding of the contextual meaning of words with different and identical tonal accents.



## **LEARNING OUTCOMES**

By the end of this course, student will be able to:

- Understand speech about familiar topics and activities (personal and professional life, society, culture);
- Interact orally in a simple way on the following topics: introductions, greetings, food, describing people, places and things, expressing likes and dislikes;
- Understand elements of Yoruba grammar and syntax, such as: the alphabet, vowels, tonal accent and sounds, nouns, pronouns, verb forms, tenses, adjectives, prepositions, and question forms;
- Give basic personal information in written form;
- Write the language using the appropriate tonal accents;
- Demonstrate an awareness and understanding of some elements of Yoruba culture.

## **ONLINE SESSIONS**

These sessions will consist of a wide-range of interactive activities, which include but are not limited to:

- pair work and group discussions
- interviews and role play
- vocabulary and grammar drills
- discussions on the cultural aspects of the language
- games (Kahoot, Bingo)
