COURSE TITLE: LET'S TALK FRENCH

NO. OF HOURS: 20 (2.5 HOURS PER WEEK FOR 8 WEEKS)

SEMESTER: MAY – JULY 2025

PREREQUISITES: LEVEL 1B FRENCH/FREN 1009

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Candidates for this course should have some prior, formal academic knowledge of the language. This course will build on the skills learnt in Level 1B French/FREN 1009 acquired from the Centre for Language Learning and aims to enhance the learner's ability to communicate effectively in French. Through face-to-face sessions, the tutor will continue to promote and foster communicative and cultural competence by guiding the students as they develop their knowledge, skills and abilities in their quest to achieve competence in the target language. To this end, learners will enhance the skills involved in conversation based on a linguistic context. Participants will learn how to interact and be proactive so they develop their autonomy in the target language.

COURSE RATIONALE:

This course will give students the opportunity to further their study of one of the languages spoken in the Caribbean region. The purpose of this course is to continue to provide students with the basic communicative skills necessary to function in predictable everyday situations and to deepen their awareness of francophone culture. Students will continue to acquire learning strategies to support them in this endeavor.
