



Minor in Cultural Studies

The Minor in Cultural Studies will prepare students for entry into the postgraduate programme in Cultural Studies since students generally enter the programme with very little exposure to Cultural Studies theories or methods of inquiry. Additionally, this Minor will complement and strengthen undergraduate offerings in areas such as Communications Studies, Gender Studies, and Sociology.

A total of fifteen (15) credits is required to complete this Minor. Students will be required to take the following compulsory courses worth twelve (12) credits:

- CLTR 2150: Introduction to Cultural Studies (Year long, 6 credits)
- CLTR 3100: Theorising Caribbean Culture (Semester I)
- CLTR 3101: Race, Culture & Nationalism (Semester II)

Students may then choose one elective course worth three (3) credits from the following:

- SOCI 2010: Anthropology of the Peoples of the Caribbean
- THEA 2010: Critical Readings in Caribbean Arts & Culture I
- FILM 2403: Caribbean Cinema I: Caribbean Film History
- FILM 3005: Caribbean Cinema II: Contemporary Caribbean Culture
- GEND 2203: Feminist Theoretical Frameworks
- GEND 3038: Gender, Ethnicity & Class: Issues of Identity, Nature & Citizenship
- CLTR 3102: Exhibiting Cultures

Or any other three (3) credit undergraduate course approved by the Cultural Studies programme coordinator.
