The Certificate in Sign Language Level 1 course will take novice signers and signers with some competence through skill development to a level of communicative proficiency where they know how, when and why to say what to whom. The organizing principle behind the course is meaningful and appropriate communication with crucial attention to visual spatial grammar and TTSL vocabulary. This course focuses on the communicative purposes of people's everyday interactions with the grammar introduced as determined by the communicative functions. The course will be structured according to the Signing Naturally Curriculum Guide, but will be adapted to address the sign language needs of Trinidad and Tobago.
