## **Undergraduate Minors and Courses**

The IGDS offers courses at undergraduate and graduate level. All individual courses are open to all students in any faculty across the campus, subject to satisfying pre-requisites. (Full list inside.)

At undergraduate level the IGDS offers a Minor in Gender Studies in collaboration with the Faculty of Humanities and Education, and a Minor in Gender and Development with the Faculty of Social Sciences. Students in any faculty can take either of these Minors.

**Registration –** We urge you to consult with staff / your academic advisor at the IGDS prior to registering on Banner. Please check the IGDS web site, notice boards and information booklet for academic staff hours and further information.

**GEND codes** – have been assigned to Humanities and Social Sciences courses offered jointly with other faculties. Ensure that you use the GEND code for the course if it is to be used for the Minor in Gender Studies or the Minor in Gender and Development.

**Note**: The requirement for the Minor in Gender Studies is fifteen (15) advanced credits (level II and III course credits) which includes six (6) core credits (two courses) in Humanities or nine (9) core credits (three courses) in Social Sciences. Please ensure that you have registered for the required courses.

**The IGDS** is an autonomous multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary unit located in the Office of the Vice-Chancellor of The University. Teaching programmes, courses, research and outreach programmes are carried out by IGDS staff in collaboration with associate staff from other faculties and departments, with local and/or international collaborating partners and with students of gender studies.

**The Ideal IGDS Graduate** will have a desire for knowledge, strong critical thinking and problem solving skills, competence in interdisciplinary gender analysis, and the ability to apply theory to policy and to everyday practices. The graduate will be actively committed to social justice, valuing both diversity and collaboration. The graduate will also understand that evaluating gender difference is central to self-awareness and a commitment to the transformation of unequal power relations.
