

ECONOMIC HIGHLIGHTS

Introduction

In his inauguration speech, **Peru's** now former president Pedro Pablo Kuczynski (2016- March 2018) pledged that by 2021, all Peruvians would have 24-hour access to clean water and be connected to the severage system. While Kuczynski was recently forced to step down over alleged corruption (see our sister publication, Latin American Weekly Report for further discussion [WR-18-11]), we consider efforts made by his government up until he quit to make good on this pledge.

Upon assuming office in May 2017, Ecuador's President Lenín Moreno launched a 'National Dialogue', to build bridges with social and political actors who opposed his predecessor, Rafael Correa (2007-2017). The move reflected Moreno's conciliatory style of politics but it also responded to more immediate political concerns. Having won the presidential elections by a wafer-thin margin, Moreno realised that he would lack legitimacy without securing broad popular support. He also recognised that his drive to stamp out corruption, revise economic policies and impose his own style of politics would cause deep ruptures within his party, Alianza País (AP). Indeed, since the elections AP has split in two, with one group supporting Moreno and another, Correa. Given that securing support beyond his core constituency has taken on renewed importance for the president, we examine his efforts to build these bridges.

We then turn to Venezuela which is due to have a presidential election next month. At the recent Summit of the Americas which took place in Peru, where top officials from the US and region gathered, those present refused to accept the election as legitimate. While placing heavy rhetorical pressure on Venezuela's President Nicolás Maduro, it provided little else in terms of tangible action. Yet, we consider the signs that individual countries are gradually readying more concrete steps to push and prod for a democratic transition in Venezuela. Staying with Venezuela, the last of our focus pieces examines a newly announced 'special transitory regime' for the oil sector, which will give the Venezuelan oil ministry temporary free rein to make administrative and operational changes – the latest sign of desperation on the part of the Maduro government, whose survival now depends entirely on recovering oil output at all costs.
