The library uses this means to provide an update of the most recent books, serials and multimedia available at the Library .

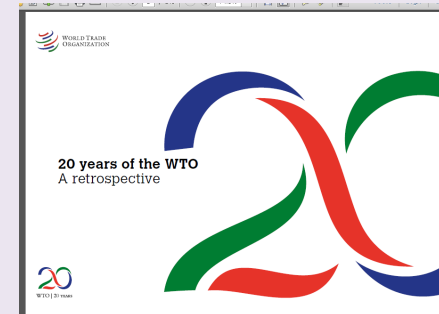

# 5 tips for Studying more effectively

**1. Plan your week out on Sundays.** Knowing what you're going to do each day will make your decision to study easier.



**2. Assign contexts to your tasks.** Know which ones requires lots of brainpower, and which ones are easy.

**3. Group the low-intensity tasks.** Doing them all at once will give you more uninterrupted study time.

**4. Try timeboxing.** Create fixed-time study sessions and try to stick to them. The time pressure will make you less likely to get distracted.

**5. View your studying as "Intellectual Combat."** If you think of your studies as an active, intellectually involved process, you'll learn much faster.
