ARGENTINA 2 Alberto takes his leap	As this issue went to press, Alberto Fernández had just been sworn in as Argentina's next president, marking the country's return to Peronism after four years of centre-right rule under now-former-president Mauricio Macri (2015-2019). One of the biggest challenges facing Fernández is how to tackle the country's deep economic crisis and necessary debt renegotiation, something on which he has remained vague throughout the transition period. The first article in this December edition of the <i>Latin American Regional Report: Brazil & Southern Cone</i> focuses on what can be expected on this front from Argentina's new president and his recently unveiled economic team.
BRAZIL 3 No return on the way	In Brazil, the presentation to congress of the government's planned economic and structural reforms has been put on hold amid fears that they might spark protests such as those seen in neighbouring Chile. Our first Brazil piece looks at the promised reform to the country's hyper-complex tax system, which will now not be tabled until next year. A second article outlines growing concerns regarding the setback to the anti-corruption fight in the country, exemplified in the recent release from prison of former president Lula da Silva (2003-2011), who continues to appeal his convictions for corruption.
BRAZIL 4 Governor overhauls anti-corruption fight	In Chile, previously the Southern Cone's most robust economy, the central bank (BCCh) is now predicting a 2.5% contraction in GDP in the fourth quarter, a direct result of the protests which broke out on 18 October and have not subsided, despite President Sebastián Piñera's gradual concessions to Chilean society's demands. Two pieces on Chile consider first some of the economic and business repercussions of the protests, and second the human rights abuse allegations that the security forces are facing following their heavy-handed repression of demonstrations – two issues which are likely to continue causing Piñera grief into the New Year.
CHILE 6 Political upheaval shakes economy	We then turn to Paraguay, where President Mario Abdo Benítez's government is also facing economic woes. As 2019 looks set to record only stagnant growth, the government is banking on a better crop harvest to provide a rebound in 2020, which would also be dependent on the situation in neighbouring Argentina.
CHILE 7 Chilean security forces face human rights abuse allegations	Finally, in Uruguay, we consider the impact of public security concerns on the presidential election, which was won by Luis Lacalle Pou of the centre-right Partido Nacional (PN) in a closer-than-expected second round on 26 November, where he obtained 48.9% of the vote.
