About the Book

The book is the result of Professor Griffith's 12-year research and writing journey that offers a policy-relevant analysis of the multidimensional threats of drugs, crime, terrorism, and cybercrime, deemed Problems Without Passports (PWP). Blending case studies with regional analysis, the book examines the regionwide impact of PWPs and the complex security and sovereignty issues at play.
