About the St Augustine Campus Libraries

The UWI St. Augustine Campus Libraries are the repository and gateway for information in support of the teaching, learning and research needs of the University community and Caribbean society. The Campus Libraries aim to develop an information literate community through the establishment and continuous improvement of an innovative information environment, the provision of excellent service and the continued development of our human resources.

There is currently an integrated network of 5 libraries at St Augustine: The Alma Jordan Library, The Medical Sciences Library, The Norman Girvan Library at The Institute of International Relations Library, The School of Education Library and The Republic Bank Library at the Arthur Lok Jack

Graduate School of Business. These libraries serve specific Departments and Faculties, but their resources can be used by all members of staff and students of the University.

Items in the collections of these five libraries can be found in a single Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC). This OPAC has been integrated into the established Single

Virtual Library Space (UWILinC), which provides a single point of discovery and access to the print and digital information resources of all four campuses of the University. UWISpace, our institutional repository, is managed by The Alma Jordan Library and serves as a digital archiving facility for the research output of the University.

A sixth library to be operationalised as part of the UWI St. Augustine Campus Library network in 2024 is the Eric Williams Memorial Library which is located in Port of Spain. This research library and museum will become the new home of the Eric Williams Memorial Collection which is presently housed and managed in The Alma Jordan Library on the main St. Augustine Campus.

Other affiliated libraries include: The Seismic Research Centre Library, The Patience-Theunissen Memorial Library at the Regional Seminary of St. John Vianney and the Uganda Martyrs, the Hugh Wooding Law School Library and the Open Campus Library.

The Alma Jordan Library

The Alma Jordan Library, (previously known as the Main Library), which officially opened at its present location in January 1970, covers a total area of 9,000 square metres. It is organised into four subject divisions: Engineering, Food and Agriculture/Science and Technology, Humanities, and Social Sciences.

Other divisions that provide information services to the UWI community of students, faculty and staff, as well as to external researchers include the Circulation and Access Services Division, and the West Indiana & Special Collections Division. The latter is a repository of international significance for research on West Indian-related topics. Among its holdings are some 150 special collections of unique West Indian materials. These include the Derek Walcott, C.L.R. James and Eric Williams Memorial Collections, which have all been named to the UNESCO Memory of the World International Register.

The Alma Jordan Library has a wide collection of electronic resources including 252 databases, with access to 106,160 electronic journal titles, and 66,498 electronic books. In addition, it has holdings of over 437,513 monographs, which increase by approximately 1000 titles annually. These holdings also include a serials collection of 57,386 bound volumes and 295 print journal titles. The Library also has 4157 audio-visual items, 1,446 cartographic items, 6,011 photographs, 4,206 multimedia and 22,784 microfilms.

Campus Librarian

The University of the West Indies (UWI) is seeking to fill the position of Campus Librarian on its St. Augustine Campus, in Trinidad and Tobago. The Campus Librarian is the most senior librarian on the Campus and this position carries overall responsibility for the administration and advancement of The University of the West Indies St. Augustine Campus Libraries in alignment with the strategic direction of the University.

The successful candidate for this position will be deeply knowledgeable about emerging library technologies and digital transformation and will use that understanding as a foundation for facilitating the continuing migration of the Libraries into a knowledge commons that integrates diverse resources, seeks opportunities for innovation, engages with stakeholders, collaborates with University units, and sustains a vibrant research and learning community.

Qualifications and Experience

A Master's degree in Library and Information Science or equivalent from an accredited institution is required. A PhD in Library Science or in any other related discipline will be an asset. The successful candidate will also possess:

- At least ten (10) years of professional library experience, with a minimum of five (5) years of senior managerial and administrative responsibility in an academic or research library
- Direct experience with overseeing the innovative advancement of library technology and furthering the creative use of emerging technologies within the library environment

 A record of research and publication in library and information science or other scholarly disciplines

Candidates with experience in directing the development of library user education programmes and tools to support the evolving curriculum and research ecosystem would have an advantage.

Experience in strategic visioning and operational planning would be considered an asset.
