About the FACULTY OF MEDICAL SCIENCES

The Faculty of Medical Sciences was founded in 1948 at Mona, Jamaica as a College of the University of London.

In 1989, teaching began at the Faculty of Medical Sciences, St. Augustine for medical, dental, veterinary and pharmacy students. In 2005, the first cohort of nursing students was accepted and in 2012, the BSc Optometry was added to the Faculty of Medical Sciences' programmes.

The Faculty is located mainly on the Eric Williams Medical Sciences Complex, which is situated approximately eight (8) miles from Port of Spain and two miles from the main campus at St. Augustine. Other clinical teaching sites include San Fernando and Port of Spain General Hospitals, Sangre Grande Hospital, Mt. Hope Maternity Hospital and Community Clinics across the country.

Programmes in the School of Pharmacy

The School of Pharmacy is located at the Eric Williams Medical Sciences Complex (Mt. Hope). The School provides sound education and training, both theoretical and practical, in the basic health sciences, the Pharmaceutical Sciences, Clinical Pharmacy and Pharmacy Practice.

The undergraduate programme is delivered via a hybrid system of didactic lectures, laboratory practical sessions, and small group

tutorials using Problem-based learning (PBL). Some of the skills taught include:

- Training to evaluate drug orders or prescriptions, compound, package and dispense drugs in appropriate dosage forms
- Manage systems for storage, preparation, and dispensing of medicines, and supervise technical personnel who may be involved in such processes
- Manage and administer a pharmacy and pharmacy practice
- Apply computer skills and technological advancements to practice
- Communicate and collaborate with health care professionals and patients regarding rational drug therapy, wellness and health promotion
- Design, implement, monitor, evaluate, and modify or recommend modifications in drug therapy in consultation with the physician to ensure effective, safe and economical patient care
- Identify, assess and solve medication related problems, and provide a clinical judgment as to the continuing effectiveness of individualized therapeutic plans and intended therapeutic outcomes
- Evaluate patients and order medications and/ or laboratory tests in accordance with established standards or practice
- Evaluate patient problems and triage patients for other health professionals as appropriate
- Monitor and counsel patients regarding the purposes, uses and effects of their medications and related therapy
- Understand relevant diet, nutrition and non-drug therapies
- Recommend, counsel and monitor patient use of non-prescription drugs
- Retrieve, evaluate and manage professional information and literature

- Use clinical data to optimize therapeutic drug regimens
- Evaluate and document interventions and pharmaceutical care outcomes.

Tenure of Appointment

Appointment as Senior Lecturer/Lecturer will normally be for three (3) years in the first instance, with eligibility for consideration for renewal.

Subsequent to the first appointment, a member of staff who has served in an equivalent position in this or some other University for a period of six (6) years will be eligible for consideration for indefinite tenure.

Appointment to this post is subject to the Charter of the University and to its Statutes, Ordinances, Rules and Regulations, including Statute 36 – Retirement of Members of Staff.

Qualifications and Experience

The successful candidate must possess a PhD or equivalent from a recognized university, which should be in Clinical Pharmacy, Pharmacy Administration or a closely related field.

Candidates should also possess:

- At least five (5) years teaching experience
- Substantial record of research and publications in reputable, peer reviewed journals
- Experience in supervision of student research projects
- Demonstrated understanding of academic pharmacy

Candidates with the following would have an advantage:

- MPharm, MPhil or MSc in Clinical Pharmacy
- ASHP accredited: Residency [Postgraduate Year 1 and/or Postgraduate Year 2] or

Fellowship which includes Licensure with the Pharmacy Board of respective country

- Post-Doctoral experience
- Publications in books, posters, conference papers
- Experience in MPhil/PhD Student supervision
- Experience with course management, lecture delivery and related software
- Experience in conducting examinations and other assessments
- Prior experience in teaching and supervising students in diverse areas related to Clinical Pharmacy Practice or Pharmacy Administration
- Research interest in clinical aspects of Pharmacy, experiential education and ACPE accreditation standards related to curriculum and experiential education

The following would be considered assets:

- PharmD
- Registration with the Board of Pharmacy Specialties
- Prior experience as a faculty member at a school or college of Pharmacy at a recognized University
- Extramural or intramural research grants

Candidates must be registered or be able to register with the Pharmacy Board of Trinidad and Tobago.

Special Responsibilities

- Participating in expanding new educational platforms, including integration of technology and active learning
- Demonstrating leadership and initiative in supporting School's assessment and accreditation efforts
- Contributing to and participating in the work of the School of Pharmacy and the University by serving on committees,

- Maintaining student office hours and advising pre-pharmacy and pharmacy students
- Teaching and supervising undergraduate and postgraduate students in various subjects
- Developing and setting up Pharmacy Practice laboratory
- Participating in Departmental and Faculty seminars
- Contributing to Departmental, Faculty or University-wide working groups or committees
