About the FACULTY OF MEDICAL SCIENCES

The Faculty of Medical Sciences was founded in 1948 at Mona, Jamaica as a College of the University of London.

In 1989, teaching began at the Faculty of Medical Sciences, St. Augustine for medical, dental, veterinary and pharmacy students. In 2005, the first cohort of nursing students was accepted and in 2012, the BSc Optometry was added to the Faculty of Medical Sciences' programmes.

The Faculty is located mainly on the Eric Williams Medical Sciences Complex, which is situated approximately eight (8) miles from Port of Spain and two miles from the main campus at St. Augustine. Other clinical teaching sites include San Fernando and Port of Spain General Hospitals, Sangre Grande Hospital, Mt. Hope Maternity Hospital and Community Clinics across the country.

School of Nursing

The School of Dentistry is located on the north-western part of the complex. The facility houses a 65 Operatory Adult Clinic, a 13 Operatory Paediatric Clinic, a 10 Operatory Emergency and Oral Diagnosis Clinic and a 6 Operatory Special Needs Clinic. The degree programme currently being offered is the DDS. Additionally, the school offers a one-year vocational training programme in General Dentistry.

THE DDS PROGRAMME

DDS programme is a 5 year competency based curriculum with a prevention focus that emphasizes the comprehensive management of the oral health of adults, children and patients with special needs. It has been offered since 1989. To date over 600 graduates are working in the Caribbean, U.S., Canada and U.K.

ACCREDITATION

The St Augustine campus is accredited by the Accreditation Council of Trinidad and Tobago. The DDS programme is accredited by the Caribbean Accreditation Authority for Medicine and other Health Professions (CAAM-HP) – the regional accrediting body.

Qualifications and Experience

The successful candidate must possess at minimum, a Doctorate degree from a recognized university, which should be in any Nursing discipline including (but not limited to) Clinical Nursing, Nursing Education, Public Health Nursing.

Candidates should also possess:

- At least five (5) years' clinical experience as a Registered Nurse (RN)
- At least five (5) years' teaching experience in Nursing
- Substantial record of relevant research and publications in reputable, peer-reviewed journals
- At least three (3) years' experience in administration or management in Nursing within a university or other tertiary level academic department, at a level equivalent to Head of Department, Deputy Dean or Dean

Candidates with the following would have an advantage:

- Professional qualifications in Nursing for Nursing Practice/Administration, Oncology or any other relevant Nursing areas
- Experience in curriculum/course management including delivery and assessments
- Experience in developing and implementing a strategic plan
- A record of supervising students and staff in a clinical environment

The following would be considered assets:

- Postgraduate qualification in Leadership or Management
- Certificate in University Teaching and Learning
- A record of impactful research and publications
- Demonstrated experience in strategic planning, change management and organizational development
- Demonstrated experience in mediation and negotiation
- A record of considerable revenue generation through grant and donor funding, and other innovative initiatives compatible with the regulatory framework of a public university
- Prior evidence of organization of Nursing seminars and workshops

Candidates must be registered or be able to be registered with the Nursing Council of Trinidad and Tobago (NCTT).

Key Responsibilities

- Determining the staffing needs (academic and ATS) to adequately service the School in all functional areas; making, soliciting, approving recommendations for recruitment, appraisal, training and promotion
- Managing academic programmes, reviewing and developing curriculum review and introducing new programmes/courses (undergraduate, postgraduate and continuing professional development)
- Managing the School's finances, developing, managing and monitoring new programmes/courses (undergraduate, postgraduate and continuing professional development)
- Directing, managing and monitoring the processes related to application, maintenance and compliance with all matters pertaining to Institutional and programme accreditation and quality assurance
- Directing the supervision and coordination of the basic and clinical sciences programmes and the services/outreach activities of the School
- Liaising with local and regional Professional Councils/Associations and other stakeholders
- Representing the School on all relevant Faculty/University and extra-University committees
- Teaching and supervising postgraduate students where necessary
- Implementing strategies to support student success, including academic advising, tutoring services, and career counselling
- Creating a supportive and inclusive learning environment that promotes equity, diversity, and inclusion

- Supervising day-to-day administration of the School and overseeing Unit Coordinators in the execution of duties
- Any other related duties as assigned by the Dean or his delegate
