Jair Emanuel Bertoni was born on 30 August 1978, in Buenos Aires, Argentina. Son of a FIFA World Cup winner (Ricardo Daniel Bertoni), Jair's passion for football began at a very early age.

He has a bachelor degree in Economics and Marketing (with honours) from the **Argentine University of Enterprise** (Universidad Argentina de la Empresa). In 2005, he got his postgraduate degree in **Management, Law and Humanities of Sport at the CIES-FIFA International Master**.

Following his postgraduate studies, Jair worked as Head of Administration (COO) of the Association of European Professional Football Leagues (EPFL) for almost 10 years. The entity is representing the voice of the 31 major European football leagues and associations of clubs at international level. Since the constitution of the Association, Jair has constantly managed the relations with senior authorities of football governing bodies (such as FIFA, UEFA, FIFPro, ECA, etc.), as well as European and international political institutions and national governments. He has been also member of several bodies within the framework of UEFA (Working Group (WG) on Calendars, WG on Intermediaries, WG on Transfer Matters...) and the European Social Dialogue (Task Force for the Implementation of the Autonomous Agreement, ESD Steering Group...).
