Exotic and Erotic: Mixing Stereotypes in the Dougla Woman's Body with Sue Ann Barratt

This presentation evaluates preliminary findings from a series of focus group discussions designed to explore the contemporary experiences of dougla individuals in Trinidad and Tobago. They emerge from a larger study of the politics of mixedness in the Caribbean with a focus on douglaness. Findings suggest that gender mediates experiences of dougla ethnicity, especially for women. According to these women, who identify as dougla based on their ethnic inheritance and their physical appearance, to be a *dougla* female is to negotiate persistent expectations of hypersexuality based on beliefs that they have inherited an 'idealised' combination of stereotypical sex characteristics from their African and Indian parents. They suggest that they are perceived as exotic, with body shape and hair texture often used to judge their beauty, desirability and authenticity as mixed females, and it is their exotic quality that marks them as erotic. The implication, according to focus group respondents, is an unwanted invasion of their sexuality and sexual harassment.
