

Michael T. Clegg

Professor Emeritus, University of California, Irvine

Michael T. Clegg received his BS and PhD degrees at the University of California, Davis in agricultural genetics and genetics respectively. During a 42-year academic career, he served on the faculty of four universities, most recently as the Donald Bren Professor of Biological Sciences at the University of California, Irvine. From 1994 to 2000 he served as Dean of the College of Natural and Agricultural Sciences at UC Riverside and he was the founding Director of the UC Riverside Genomics Institute. Clegg served for 12 years as Foreign Secretary of the US National Academy of Sciences. Clegg is a former Co-Chair of the Inter American Network of Academies of Science (IANAS) and he served as project coordinator for the IANAS publications on Food and Nutrition Security in the Americas. He is currently Vice President (External) of the International Council for Science (ICSU) and the Chair of the Council of the International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis (IIASA) based in Austria. Clegg's research specialty is population genetics and agricultural genetics where he has published extensively. Clegg is a Member of the US National Academy of Sciences, the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and the American Philosophical Society. He is a Fellow of the World Academy of Sciences (TWAS) and a corresponding member of several academies in Latin America and Africa.
