She earned her PhD in Sociology at Humboldt University in Berlin with the thesis "Ethnicized Citizenship as Illegitimate Citizenship. Andrea's case studies included the Mapuche in Chile and North-easterners in India" conducting fieldwork in Chile and India. She holds a Master degree in Sociology from Alberto Hurtado University in Chile. She is a member of the research network "Queer Studies, Decolonial Feminisms and Cultural Transformations" (QDFCT) and research associate at "Mapuche Data Project". Her research interests are citizenship, migration, indigenous people, ethnicity, decolonialism and feminism.



Sebastian Garbe is a Research Assistant and PhD student at the Faculty of Social and Cultural Sciences at the Justus-Liebig-Universität Giessen. He holds a M.A. degree in social and cultural anthropology from the University of Vienna. His research has been funded by the International Graduate Centre for the Study of Culture (GCSC) and is a member of the research network Queer Studies, Decolonial Feminisms and Cultural Transformations (QDFCT). He has collaborated in translating the work of Aníbal Quijano and Silvia Rivera Cusicanqui into German. His research interests are the socio-cultural and political connections between Latin America/ the Caribbean and Europe, post- and decolonial theory, global history, critical epistemology as well as social and protest movements, especially indigenous movements, internationalism and global solidarities. He is also an active member in the political-pedagogical project Frankfurt Postkolonial.
