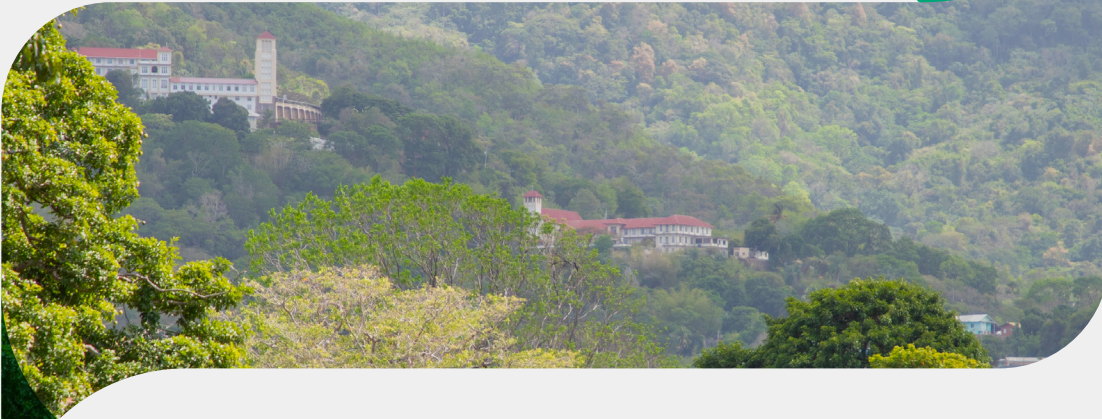

# GENERAL INFORMATION

## Definitions & Explanations

### Definition of a Student

A person is considered to be a UWI student only after the completion of registration and payment of all fees (tuition, compulsory and hall fees) for the semester. A student who writes an examination(s) for a course(s) for which he/she was not registered and paid for will not be credited for such course(s).

### Accounts Receivable Hold (AR Hold)

An AR Hold is placed on the accounts of students who have not paid fees and/ or submitted all required registration documents. This HOLD prevents access to a number of services including but not limited to registration, access to grades, examinations and transcripts, and can only be removed by the Student Accounts & Receivables Section of the Bursary.

### Subsidies

Students receiving subsidies are required to pay the percentage of their tuition fee as per their contract agreement.

### How to Calculate Fees Payable

Once you have calculated your Tuition Fees, add the annual compulsory fees and the Fee Pay Enrolment Fee listed in this Fee Booklet. These are now all the fees payable to the University.

### How to Calculate the Total Cost of Pursuing Your Programme

Once you have calculated your Tuition, Compulsory Fees and Fee Pay Enrolment Fee, add the estimated cost of your personal expenses. This figure will be the estimated cost of your entire programme. Personal expenses will vary from one individual to the next based on your circumstances (e.g., meals, travel and accommodation costs).

### Full-time and Part-time

Students are classified according to the status assigned by their respective programme upon acceptance.

### Tuition Costs Paid by Nationals from UWI Contributing Countries

The University of the West Indies is a regional institution supported by 17 contributing Caribbean countries. The University also recognises 22 other countries which are members of the Association of Caribbean States (ACS). Tuition fees vary according to the nationality of the student ([see list of countries in table below](#)).

Tuition fees for nationals of contributing countries **who are sponsored by their governments** have been calculated at 20% of the 2025/2026 economic cost. Contributing governments pay the remaining 80% of the economic cost on behalf of each sponsored student.

Students from **non-campus contributing countries** would be allowed to pay the fee applicable to T&T nationals once a letter of sponsorship for economic cost from their respective governments is provided.

### GORTT

Government of the Republic of Trinidad & Tobago.

### Self-Financing Programmes

Not all programmes are sponsored by governments. Students pursuing self-financing programmes are responsible for paying their own tuition in addition to the other fees listed.

### Living Expenses

Living expenses are separate from tuition and compulsory fees. They include accommodation, meals, transportation, personal items such as clothing and toiletries, as well as books and learning materials. As such, this cost varies from person to person and from faculty to faculty. Below are some general estimates that you can use as a guide.

# FINANCING YOUR PROGRAMME

## Higher Education Loan Programme (HELP)

A HELP Loan is a low interest student loan available through local commercial banks. Students must apply for the loan annually and must fulfil the following criteria:

- be citizens of Trinidad & Tobago
- have a continued period of residency of 3 years prior to application
- be between 18 and 50 years of age

### NOTES:

- HELP loans cover tuition expenses (if not rated 100% through Means Test) and non-tuition expenses.
- Students studying in Trinidad & Tobago who meet all the criteria above are eligible to borrow up to a maximum of TT\$35,000 per year.
- Students studying elsewhere in the region who meet all the criteria above are eligible to borrow up to a maximum of TT\$75,000 per year.
- The amount received is based on the Means Test Criteria for HELP loans.

## Scholarships & Bursaries (Postgraduate)

Scholarships and bursaries are also available for postgraduate students, each with varying eligibility requirements. **You must be a registered student to apply.**

## Government Assistance for Tuition Expenses (GATE)

The Government Assistance for Tuition Expenses (GATE) programme **does not fund postgraduate programmes.**

# HOW TO PAY FEES

## *The FEE PAY Payment Plan*

Fee Pay is a payment plan which grants users automatic financial clearance on enrolment.

As part of the registration process, **ALL students are required to enrol in Fee Pay**. The plan is accessed through “My Secure Area” on the Student Portal.

Fee Pay recognises two categories of students:

- Sponsored (e.g. Scholarships)
- Non-Sponsored (self-funded)

**Fee Pay combines the payments due for tuition and compulsory fees.** These fees are then payable in instalments each semester as follows:

## *Financial Clearance*

**Financial Clearance is required** for students to:

- Access myeLearning to view online course materials and to submit coursework assessments online
- Take in-person final exams
- See exam results
- Use facilities like the Health Services Unit and The Alma Jordan Library
- Graduate, access transcripts, certificates etc.

If you miss payment deadlines, an **Accounts Receivable (AR) Hold** will be placed on your account. This hold restricts access to the activities and services listed above.

## *How to Get Financial Clearance*

Follow the steps below to get and maintain your financial clearance.

1. **Enrol in Fee Pay for Automatic Financial Clearance:**
  - **FIRST** - enrol in the **Fee Pay system** during the registration period to get automatic financial clearance.
  - **SECOND** - make sure to **enrol in a Fee Pay payment plan** whether you are paying your fees in instalments or all at once. If you do not sign up for a payment plan, you will not get automatic financial clearance.
  - **THIRD** – start making payments using any of the [payment methods](#) listed later in this section.
2. **Make Scheduled Payments to Maintain Financial Clearance:**
  - Submit all your registration documents on or before the due date for the **first** installment.
  - Follow the payment schedule outlined in Fee Pay and ensure that all payments are made by the specified deadlines.
  - Would you like to pay more than the amount due (pre-pay)? The Fee-Pay system allows you to adjust the figure to be paid. Your payments will be automatically reflected and your remaining installments recalculated.

## Payment Methods

Once you have enrolled in Fee Pay, the Campus provides a variety of convenient payment methods:

1. Online Payment via mySecureArea using FEE PAY (**highly recommended**)
2. Online Payment using a credit card OR chip debit cards (international and local cards accepted)
3. Online Inter-bank Transfers/Internet banking (local banks only) \*
4. Deposit at any branch of Republic Bank in Trinidad & Tobago using the UWI deposit slip\*\*
5. Wire transfer (for students based outside Trinidad & Tobago)

### NOTES

\* UWI is a registered Bill Payee with Republic Bank's online banking service. To pay your UWI fees through Republic Bank's online banking, follow these steps:

1. Log in to RBL online banking, go to "Pay"
2. Select "Company/Utility Payment"
3. Choose "Other-Utility to Pay"
4. Under "Education," select "The UWI St. Augustine Students"

## Caution Money

Caution money is payable by all students upon entry to The University. It is refunded on completion or withdrawal from a programme. To apply for a refund:

1. Download and fill out the [Caution Money Refund Application Form](#)
2. Apply for Faculty Clearance - Email the completed form to the appropriate address/addresses listed in the table below for the Dean's signature. Some Faculties also require that you apply for Departmental and/or Lab clearance.
3. Apply for Library Clearance – Fill out the [online library clearance form](#). Responses are usually received via email within four working days.
4. Submit completed Refund Application form with Dean's signature AND Library Clearance to the [Bursary Service Desk](#).

### Qualifying Students

Students who are required to read for undergraduate courses or are required to pass a special qualifying examination before registering for higher degrees, will pay per-credit fees for their faculty. In addition, all compulsory fees, and a qualifying examination fee of **TT\$50** are payable upon registration at the beginning of the academic year.

### Taught Masters – Project Only Fee (exclude MPhil and PhD)

1. Full-time nationals who are completing a project over an entire academic year have the option to change status to part-time and pay part-time fees, in addition to all compulsory fees.
2. Students not sponsored by contributing governments must pay a Project Only fee equivalent to 20% of the higher tuition fee.
3. Students from other countries must pay a Project Only fee equivalent to 20% of the US dollar fee.

### Higher Degrees (MPhil and PhD)

Students must continue to pay fees until the submission of their thesis to the Office of Graduate Studies & Research.

#### NOTE:

1. If the thesis or project is submitted before September 30 (semester 1) or end of February (semester 2), only the registration fee of TT\$20.00 is payable.
2. After submission students must continue to register and pay the registration fee for the academic year until awarded.

## Self-Financing Programmes

### Tuition Fee Waiver

There is no tuition fee waiver for self-financing programmes.

### Project

1. Once the cost of the programme has been paid in full, students are only required to pay compulsory fees until submission of their final project.
2. After submission of the project, students must continue to register and pay the registration fee for the academic year until they are awarded.

### Halls of Residence Fees

Students who have been accepted to live on a Hall of Residence are required to pay the Hall Application Fee and Hall Precautionary Fee using the following link:

Hall Accommodation fees can be paid either in full at the beginning of each semester or monthly. Payments can be made using any of the following options:

- online via mySecureArea using a valid credit or debit chip card
- at any branch of Republic Bank in Trinidad and Tobago
- online bank transfer from any local banking institution
- by wire transfer (for foreign-based students)
