- During the period October December 2017, the CTTERF committee reformed to rally behind our neighbouring Caribbean islands who were devastated by natural disasters and sought help.
- Hurricane Maria ravished our Caribbean neighbours. Vehement winds ripped roofs, damaged infrastructure and left thousands without electricity. Floods buried landscapes of islands. The biggest impact however, was felt on the citizens of these countries. Many were left homeless, seeking refuge and wondering where their next meal or clean water were coming from. The losses were unimaginable.
- Like many non-profit groups, the CTTERF was compelled to act for aid. With regional and international bodies partnering to lend their support, we wanted to GIVE MORE.
- The CTTERF's missions encapsulates **Agenda 2030 for Sustainable Development** wherein "No One Is Left Behind". 


The "GIVE MORE" Initiative
