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ABOUT THE UWI GAMES

The UWI Games are one of the longest running traditions at The University of the West Indies, with their roots in the **1960s**. Held every **two years**, the Games bring student athletes from across the region together for a **seven day inter campus sporting competition**.

In **2026**, athletes, officials, and supporters will gather at the **St. Augustine Campus**, travelling from their home campuses to compete, build friendships, and represent their Campus as part of a wider Caribbean sporting community.

The Games feature **ten sporting disciplines**, including cricket, football, basketball, netball, volleyball, hockey, swimming, table tennis, tennis, and track and field, reinforcing the values of fair play, campus pride, and student excellence.

Participation is open exclusively to **registered UWI students** combining **competition, camaraderie, and regional connection**.

The UWI Games logo is all about unity, campus pride, and friendly rivalry.

The colourful arcs represent the five UWI campuses — Mona, St. Augustine, Cave Hill, Global, and Five Islands — coming together to compete, connect, and celebrate sport. The order of the colours follows the history of UWI's growth, linking today's athletes to generations before them.

The flowing, overlapping design reflects the Caribbean spirit: many islands, many talents, one team. Just like on the field, each campus brings its own energy, culture, and champions, and together we are stronger.

ABOUT TRINIDAD & TOBAGO

The UWI Games 2026 website is a great place to start for links to information on things to do and places to go in Trinidad. Here are a few fun facts you may not know about this year's host country:

Population: 1.4 million

Trinidad & Tobago's first Olympic gold medalist was Hasely Crawford - men's 100 meters at the Montreal Olympics in 1976

The world's largest natural deposit of asphalt is the Pitch Lake in southwestern Trinidad

The world's oldest legally protected forest reserve is the Tobago Main Ridge Forest Reserve, established in 1776 and now recognized by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site.

In 2023, the United Nations designated 11 August each year as World Steelpan Day. The steelpan was invented in Trinidad & Tobago in the 1930's and is the only musical instrument invented in the 20th century.

ACCOMODATION

Participants in the UWI Games 2026 will be accommodated in three designated Halls of Residence at the St. Augustine Campus. These assignments are designed to support smooth coordination, and a comfortable stay for all contingents.

Hall Assignments by Campus

- Mona Campus – **Canada Hall** (located on the Main Campus)
- Cave Hill Campus – **Freedom Hall** (located just off the Main Campus)
- Five Islands Campus, Global Campus and St. Augustine Campus – **Sir Arthur Lewis Hall of Residence aka SAL Hall** (St John's Road, a short distance from the Main Campus)

FACILITIES & AMENITIES

Each Hall of Residence provides access to shared facilities to support daily living and recreation, including:

- Shared bathroom facilities
- Communal kitchenettes
- Laundry facilities
- Common rooms, study areas and recreational spaces
- Computer Lab

Use of shared facilities is guided by posted regulations and hall policies.

ROOM TYPES & OCCUPANCY

Rooms are assigned based on availability and the size of each contingent. Accommodation may include:

- **Single occupancy rooms** – one (1) resident per room
- **Double occupancy rooms** – two (2) residents per room

Residents must strictly observe assigned occupancy limits. Room changes and overnight guests are **not permitted** unless officially approved. All residents are required to follow Hall regulations related to safety, conduct, and shared living.

Check In Requirements

To check in to your assigned Hall of Residence, you must present one of the following:

- **A valid government issued photo ID, or**
- **A UWI student ID**

A campus map is provided at the end of this booklet to help you locate the Halls of Residence and nearby essential amenities.



ACCESS

All contingents will have access to a free, password protected Wi Fi network created specifically for participants in the UWI Games 2026.

The Wi Fi service is available in the Halls of Residence and in main areas across the campus.

Access requires authentication.

Instructions and a QR code will be provided at check in on your Hall.

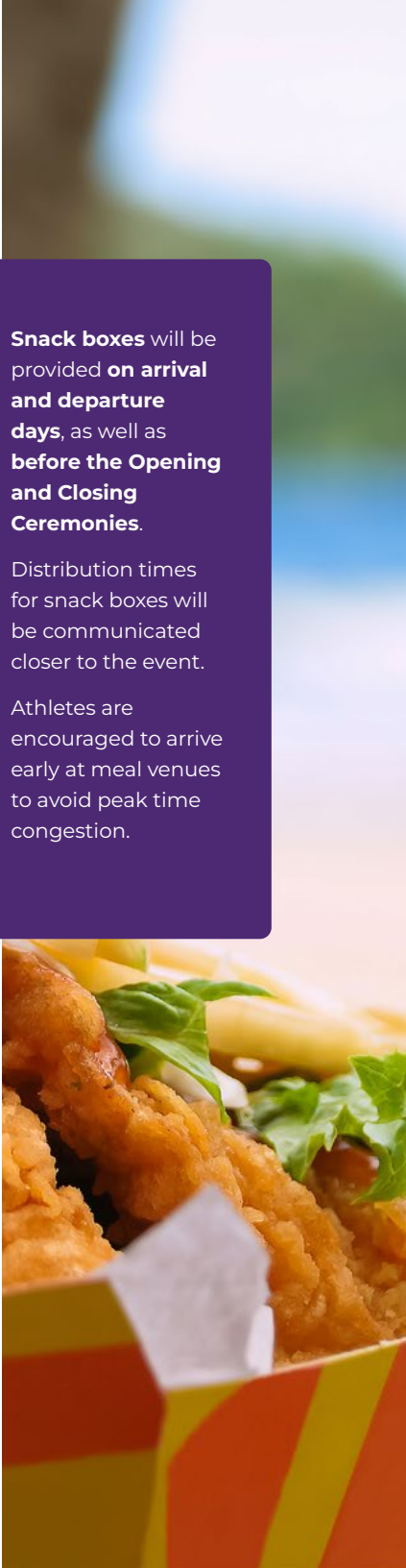

- **Snack boxes** will be provided **on arrival and departure days**, as well as **before the Opening and Closing Ceremonies**.
- Distribution times for snack boxes will be communicated closer to the event.
- Athletes are encouraged to arrive early at meal venues to avoid peak time congestion.



TRANSPORTATION

On Campus

The University operates a Student Shuttle Service, which provides free transportation for students. Students must produce/display UWI I.D. Cards to access this service.

The Student Shuttle Service provides transportation between different campus locations according to the schedules for each respective route outlined on the campus website at <https://sta.uwi.edu/campus-security/shuttle>

Campus stops include:

- JFK Underpass - close to the JFK Auditorium
- Student Activity Centre (SAC) not far from SPEC and Canada Hall
- The Tennis Court - not far from Freedom Hall
- Sir Arthur Lewis Hall of Residence

To the Games Venues

A special UWI Games Transportation Schedule will be provided through the head of your contingent.



HEALTH & MEDICAL SERVICES

Your health and safety are a top priority throughout the UWI Games 2026. A comprehensive, 24 hour medical support plan has been coordinated through the Health Services Unit (HSU) and will be in place for the entire duration of the Games.

This plan ensures continuous medical coverage across:

- All competition venues
- The St. Augustine Campus
- The Halls of Residence

On Site Medical Support

- **Medical personnel are available 24/7** throughout the Games.
- Immediate care will be provided for injuries or illnesses, including assessment, treatment, stabilisation, and referral where necessary.
- Medical teams will maintain a visible presence at all Games locations to help ensure a safe environment for athletes, officials, and support staff.

Competition Venue Coverage

- **Ambulance and emergency medical services** have been coordinated to allow for rapid, on site response in the event of an emergency.
- At **high risk sporting events**, doctors and trained medical staff will be present.
- At **medium and low-risk events**, coverage will be provided by a combination of physicians and trained first aid volunteers.

Athletes are encouraged to report injuries early, even if they seem minor, to reduce the risk of further harm.

All injuries assessed by HSU staff are documented. Athletes may request:

- A brief medical report
- Guidance on return-to-play or follow-up treatment at your home campus

Hospital and Specialist Care

- Athletes requiring **secondary or tertiary medical care** will be referred to a private healthcare facility once valid insurance coverage is confirmed, or
- Transferred to the **Eric Williams Medical Sciences Complex** for further investigation and treatment, as needed.

Campus Pharmacy – Extended Hours

The Campus Pharmacy is normally open Monday to Friday, 8:30 am to 4:00 pm. However, to support the safety and wellbeing of all during the Games, extended opening hours will apply from Friday 22 May to Friday 29 May 2026 as follows:

- **Friday 22 May and Monday 25 May to Friday 29 May**
8:30 am to 7:00 pm
- **Saturday 23 May and Sunday 24 May**
9:00 am to 5:00 pm

Athletes should carry essential personal medications with them at all times.

Maps at the end of this brochure show additional

pharmacy locations near the Campus.

Athletes with Pre-existing Conditions

If you have a pre-existing condition (e.g. asthma, diabetes, or epilepsy) please:

- declare your condition during registration
- carry personal medications at all times
- inform team officials and medical staff before competition

This will help officials provide a quick response if you become unwell.

After Hours Care On Hall:

On-call medical personnel, Games officials, Hall Managers and the HSU will coordinate in case of emergency.

Serious cases will be transferred via ambulance to the nearest public or private hospital.

The medical personnel on-site should be your first point of contact for any injury during play or warm-up.



Staying Well During the Games

Student athletes are encouraged to:

Stay hydrated, especially in warm conditions

Eat regularly and attend scheduled meals

Get adequate rest between competitions

Carry essential personal medications with you at all times

Report injuries, illness, or physical concerns promptly

Look out for your teammates!
